





- Do not block the view of other participants.









Do you feel there are enough parks and/or recreation centers within walking distance of your home?



## ALMOST TWO THIRDS of respondents think parks are in excellent or good condition.







How would you rate the physical condition of Los Angeles parks?






How would you rate the physical condition of Los Angeles recreation centers?


Is there at least one park or recreation facility in Los Angeles where you feel safe?






What prevents you from using parks and recreation facilities or programs more often?

The PerSquareMile tool, developed by GreenInfo Network and the UCLA Institute of the Environment and Sustainability, was used to identify potential new park locations and areas with the greatest number of people in need of nearby parks. The tool was used to assess two metrics:

Park access - the number of people without a park within a 10-minute walk of their homes Park supply - the number of park acres per thousand people
